



- ◇ If you wish to drink wine from the Chalice, go to the cup distributor. Guide the cup to your mouth and take a sip.
- ◇ Please **do not** dip your bread into the cup.
- ◇ Gluten free wafers are available. Ask the Priest when you come to receive.
- ◇ If you have a hard time walking, the Usher will have the Priest bring the Eucharist to you.
- ◇ If you don't wish to receive you may come to the Priest for a blessing. Cross your arms over your chest and the Priest will know to give you a blessing.
